SNL Accomplishments This Past Year

Consejo Estatal (Statewide Council of Immigrant Leaders) was created and (after Sr. Martha's transfer to Rome) continues Spiritual Formation and Circle Leaders' Psychotherapy Sessions (trauma).

New Circles of Support have emerged in parishes, high schools, among farmworkers – and among friends/family groups. We have held 3 monthly Assemblies of Circle Leaders in light of the present national crisis in our communities. Know Your Rights presentations in 3 parishes and a farmworkers' camp have led to new Circles of Support.

Our Northern Michigan Welcoming Network is organizing churches, schools, agencies, grassroots organizations to welcome newcomers and immigrants. Gaylord Diocese Parishes are conducting Listening Campaigns following a Day of Reflection on Catholic Social Teaching.

Youth in Action for Immigration held its Annual Conference, conducts presentations in High Schools, joins a monthly Immigration Justice Vigil in Clark Park (SW Detroit) and traveled to the Border with the Sisters of Mercy.

Education: Know Your Rights presentations in Parishes, a "Journey to Exile" Jesuit Refugee Services Workshop, Immigrant presentations in schools and parishes, and a series of 4 Summertime Webinars ("Immigration Hot Button Issues"). Our newsletter is back on a monthly schedule.

Dozens of Families-in-Crisis received Direct Support: housing and community for 5 asylum-seeking mothers (and their toddlers) at Bakhita House (Christ the King); rent and utility assistance, rides to appointments (e.g., Chicago Children's Hospital), connection to lawyers through 10+ Parish Circles of Support.

Farmworker Outreach: distributed educational materials on Bird Flu to Dairy Workers and community groups in the Thumb and Mid-Michigan as part of a Center for Disease Control grant through the National Center for Farmworker Health.

Advocacy: leading up to an anticipated vote in the State Legislature for Drivers Licenses for Immigrants, SNL organized a delegation of Nuns to the Governor's Office, over 500 people at the Detroit Cathedral for the Vatican's 110th World Day of Prayer for Migrants and Refugees, 180 people to Lansing forAdvocacy Day – and a delegation of 4 immigrant women met with Grand Rapids Bishop Walkowiak.

CONSEJO ESTATAL (Statewide Council) was formed by 18 immigrant leaders representing 10 Circles of Support across Michigan as their organizer Sr. Martha was being transferred to Rome by her religious order. CONSEJO ESTATAL continued the spiritual theme presentations and the psychotherapy sessions for members, and met met with the head of the Michigan Dept. of Education to voice their concerns.

We have been working to ensure that every person can know their rights and understand how to act if they encounter Border Patrol. We held workshops in parishes in Romeo, Sterling Heights, and Ecorse. Workshop attendees learn how to designate someone to temporarily care for their children in the event of a family separation; what to do if ICE or CBP show up at their workplace, home, or if they are detained while walking down the street or driving; how to recognize a DOJlicensed immigration attorney and protect themselves from possible fraud by individuals unauthorized to practice law. The workshops last one hour and are free of charge. If you would like this workshop to be held at your parish, please contact us. We would be happy to visit!

YOUTH IN ACTION FOR IMMIGRATION

Youth in Action for Immigration is Strangers No Longer's regional youth leadership committee. Young leaders from 12 Catholic High Schools and Parish Youth Groups meet monthly to learn about immigration and reflect on how their faith calls them to action and advocacy. This past year....

Three groups traveled to Texas for an immersive week at the US-Mexico Border.



At various parishes, youth leaders presented the ways their faith inspires them to support immigrants.

Youth leaders held a Poster Party in preparation for the International Day of Migrants and Refugees Mass and Pilgrimage.





Youth led the Pilgrimage at the Cathedral, and participated in the joyful Mass for the Day of Migrants and Refugees.

In Lansing, youth leaders met their Representatives, Senators, and the Governor's staff to advocate for the Drive Safe Bills.

100 students participated in this youth-led day of learning, reflection, action, and fellowship.

Outreach to Dairy Workers

Strangers No Longer Avian Influenza Team

Because of our work in rural areas of Michigan (**Dioceses** of **Gaylord and Saginaw**), in August of 2024, SNL received funding administered by the National Center for Farmworker Health to deliver talks and training sessions to workers in the dairy industry. The focus of these sessions is on preventing the transmission of avian influenza and identifying its symptoms in both livestock and individuals, thereby facilitating early detection.

Our team comprises eight individuals located in the Thumb and Mid-Michigan regions. They provide training and informational sessions at dairy farms, churches, schools, Latino supermarkets, and farmworker residences. The primary audience for these efforts consists of Spanish-speaking workers, who have received the shared information with gratitude. Furthermore, some individuals have formed a Circle of Support in SNL.



Dairy Workers Are at Risk for H5N1 Bird Flu

How to Protect Yourself from the Virus at Work

Avian influenza H5N1, also known as bird flu, is a very contagious virus that normally makes birds sick. Recently, the virus has changed and now it is making cows and people sick. People who work with cows are at higher risk of getting sick from bird flu.

Learn how to protect yourself from this virus!

How do people get sick?

We do not know how the bird flu is spreading from cows to humans, but we do know that sick cows have a lot of the virus in their milk. Cows can also spread the virus through their spit, feces, and other body fluids. It's important to be very careful around cows and milk that has not been pasteurized (heated up enough to kill any viruses or germs).

What can you do to protect yourself from bird flu?

Take these steps to protect yourself from getting sick with bird flu if you work with cows:

- 1. Wash your hands right away after working with cows, handling sick or dead animals, and before you take any breaks. Wash for at least 20 seconds with soap and water, then rinse and dry
- DO NOT touch your face, nose, mouth, or eyes while working with cows or touching anything that cows or their milk have touched.
- 3. DO NOT eat food with dirty hands or gloves without washing your hands first or using hand sanitizer.
- DO NOT drink raw milk or eat products made with raw milk (like some types of queso fresco) that have not been pasteurized.
- 5. Use Personal Protection Equipment (PPE). Your employer should give you:











What symptoms should you look for?

It's important to seek medical care if you start feeling sick with these symptoms:



- Fever (temperature of 100° F or 37.8° C or more)
- Chills
- Stomach and body pain
- Cough
- Red or swollen eyes
- Difficulty breathing

How can you find out if you have bird flu?

If you have any of these symptoms, it's important to go to a health center or hospital to be tested for bird flu.

When you go to get tested:

- Your doctor or nurse can check to see if you the flu by using a cotton swab in your throat, nose, or eyes.
- If you have flu, they will do another test with the cotton swab to see
 if you have bird flu or a human flu. Your doctor can give you medicine
 to help with your symptoms if you have any type of flu.
- If your test results come back show that you have bird flu, your doctor or nurse will give you more information about next steps, which may include staying home from work and gatherings until your symptoms are gone.

If you do not have health insurance, you can ask your health center or local pharmacy for any discounts to help you cover the cost.

*Please remember to tell the doctor or nurse that you work with animals like cows or poultry!

Equipo de Gripe Aviar de Strangers no Longer

Gracias a nuestro trabajo en las parroquias del área rural de Michigan (Diócesis de Gaylord), en agosto de 2024 recibimos un financiamiento administrado por el Centro Nacional para la Salud del Trabajador Agrícola, para dar charlas y entrenamiento a los trabajadores de la industria láctea, con un enfoque en la prevención de los contagios de la influenza aviar y la identificación de los síntomas, tanto en ganado vacuno como en las personas, para una pronta detección.

Nuestro equipo se compone por 8 personas, localizadas en el área del Pulgar y Central de Michigan, proporcionando capacitaciones y charlas en granjas lecheras, iglesias, escuelas, supermercados latinos y residencia de los trabajadores, enfocándose principalmente en trabajadores de habla hispana, los cuales han recibido con agradecimiento la información compartida y algunos se han sumado a los Círculos de apoyo de Strangers no Longer.



STRANGERS NO LONGER IN NORTHERN MICHIGAN

In September 2024, 100 parishioners from 20 parishes in the Diocese of Gaylord attended a Day of Reflection on Catholic Social Teaching at the Cathedral in Gaylord.



Parishes then formed Listening Teams, to listen to fellow parishioners and community members and learn which common good issues are of concern in their communities. Soon, they will discern how to respond to these needs.

Additionally, the State's Office of Global Michigan awarded Strangers No Longer a grant to establish and facilitate a network of institutions welcoming immigrants and refugees in Michigan's northern lower peninsula.



This active collaborative educates local communities, provides support and resources to newcomers and the institutions serving them, and advocates for culturally appropriate solutions to immigrants' needs.
